Your Protection

In accordance with VA Code§ 19.2-11.2, upon request of any witness in a criminal prosecution of any gang or drug related case, or any violent felony as defined by subsection C of§ 17.1-805, or any crime victim, a law enforcement agency, the attorney for the Commonwealth, the counsel for the defendant, a court, nor the Department of Corrections, nor their employees, may not disclose, except among themselves] the residential address, telephone number, email address, or place of employment of the witness or victim or a member of the witness' or victim's family, except as permitted in the Code of Virginia.

Except with the written consent of the victim of any crime involving any sexual assault, sexual abuse, or family abuse or the victim's next of kin if the victim is a minor and the victim's death results from any crime, a law-enforcement agency may not disclose to the public information that directly or indirectly identifies the victim of such crime except to the extent that disclosure is (a) of the site of the crime, (b) required by law, (c) necessary for law-enforcement purposes, or (d) permitted by the court for good cause. In addition, at the request of the victim to the Court of Appeals of Virginia or the Supreme Court of Virginia hearing, on or after July 1, 2007, the case of a crime involving any sexual assault or sexual abuse, no appellate decision shall contain the first or last name of the victim.

Liberty University Assistance

Options available to victims include University administrative action, criminal prosecution, or civil suit. Notifying any University employee or contacting the Office of Equity and Compliance or Office of Community Life will initiate university administrative action. However, Student Counseling Services is a completely confidential resource and will not initiate any action without the directive of the reporting party. During any campus administrative proceedings, both the alleged victim and the accused may have an advisor present to provide support. The Office of Equity and Compliance can assist both the accused and the alleged victim, if requested, in connecting them to resources which include but are not limited to making any necessary changes in their housing or academic situation, implementing a No Contact Directive, or connecting them with Student Counseling Services.
