- 120 Credit hours must be 100-400 level courses (HIST 502 and HIUS 597 included)
- 2.5 Overall grade point average required for undergraduate degree
- 3.0 Overall grade point average required for graduate degree
- 30 Credit hours of undergraduate courses must be upper-level (300-400 level)
- **Grade of 'C'** Minimum required for all upper level courses in the major (300-400 level)
- Grade of 'C' No more than two grades of C may be applied to Masters level courses (includes grades of C+ & C-)
- Grade of 'D' No grades of D may be applied to Masters level courses (including grades Of D+ and D-)
 - 25% Of the undergraduate courses in the major must be taken through Liberty University
 - 50% Of Graduate Degree taken through Liberty University
 - 30 Credit hours of undergraduate courses must be taken through Liberty
 - **6 years** Degree must be completed within 6 years
 - Grad App Submission of Degree Completion Application must be completed within the last semester of a student's anticipated graduation date
